Welcome to Payson High School. This year, we welcome back our senior class of 2025! They will be the 113th class to graduate from Payson High School, and the last class to graduate from our current building, a significant milestone in our school history. Each graduating class has a unique journey ahead of them, and we are excited to be a part of this pivotal time of life.

Registration

If you didn't complete the registration process this spring or are a new move-in to Nebo or Payson High School boundaries, <u>visit this site to complete registration</u>.

School Start and Fees

School starts on August 14 at 8:00 am. Fees can be paid anytime on <u>My School Fees</u> as well. If financial assistance is needed, fill out this <u>fee waiver application</u> and submit it to the front office anytime between July 29 - August 9 (8:30-3:30). Please email your administrator directly to set up appointments if needed. When applying for a fee waiver, bring proof of income, last year's tax return, or two recent pay stubs.

Class Schedules

Schedules are available on August 1st in <u>Infinite Campus</u>. To make class changes this year, students will use Infinite Campus. More instruction on how to do this will be sent out later. All students are required to have a complete class schedule at the beginning of the school year. To make an appointment with your school counselor, please see the <u>counseling website</u>.

Sophomore Orientation & Back-to-School Night

All sophomores and new PHS students are welcome to attend Sophomore Orientation on **Monday the 12th at 3 pm in the auditorium.** This will be followed by a school-wide open house from 4–6 pm for all students to attend. Teachers will be in their classrooms to answer questions, and we will help you find your classes. Parents are also welcome to attend!

School Breakfast & Lunch

Payson High School is an open campus; students can leave for lunch. Many students bring lunch from home, purchase food from a local restaurant, vending machine, or eat in the cafeteria. Breakfast (\$1.50) and lunch (\$2.50) are available to students daily. You can pay for school meals here.

To qualify for free or reduced-price meals for the 24-25 school year, fill out a Meal Benefits Application. Qualification is based on factors including household size, income, participation in assistance programs such as SNAP, FDPIR, and TANF, as well as living situations such as homelessness and migrant or refugee status. Online applications will become available on July 17th. You may access an application by going to your Infinite Campus Menu, scrolling to More, and clicking Meal Benefits. Any application signed before July 16th does not pertain to the 2024-25 school year. As a reminder, households must apply annually to confirm free or reduced-price meal eligibility.

Picture Day

School pictures will be taken on August 29-30 in the west gym. All students need to have their picture taken to be issued a school ID and/or to be in the yearbook.

Chromebooks

We will be 1:1 with Chromebooks again this year. Students will be issued a school Chromebook to be used and taken home daily. Sophomores get a new computer they can use for three years with an option to purchase it for \$30 at the end of their time at PHS. The cost to replace a damaged or stolen Chromebook is \$300, and the student will be charged for it.

An optional Chromebook Protection Plan is available for \$30 per year. This will cover the initial cost of a damaged Chromebook. We encourage parents to purchase the Chromebook Protection Plan in case of damage. The Chromebook Protection Plan can be paid for online through myschoolfees.com, along with all other fees. Lockers

Lockers will be issued **by request only** and at no cost to students. Most students do not use lockers, but you are welcome to request one. To request a locker, please fill out this <u>Google Form</u>.

Student Parking

Due to building construction, parking is limited. Therefore, **sophomores will not be issued parking passes this year**. Sophomores with a driver's license can drive to school, but they must park east of Main Street at the city softball park. Please be aware of parking restrictions, rules, and changes.

Parking in the south lot will be open all year for junior and senior students with a **parking permit correctly displayed.** To request a parking permit, fill <u>out this form</u>. Parking permits can be purchased on <u>myschoolfees.com</u>. We highly recommend riding the bus, carpooling, walking if you live close, or getting dropped off. Parking is strictly enforced, and cars parked illegally or without parking passes will be ticketed.

We take great pride in maintaining a clean campus. Students who litter the parking lot will be ticketed and could lose their parking privileges.

Students can only work off tickets during the term the ticket was issued. We encourage students to pay for parking tickets promptly.
